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THUS THE REAL SEQUENCE OF THE SLOGAN IS: EDUCATE, AGITATE AND ORGANIZE

Educate, Organize and Agitate is the most misquoted slogan of Baba Sahib Dr. Ambedkar. Its true version is: Educate Agitate and Organize. Baba Sahib uttered these precious words at the end of his historic speech delivered at the All-India Depressed Classes Conference (July 18-19, 1942 at Nagpur), convened to create an All-India organization with distinct aims and purposes in co-operation with all the inter-provincial forces. It was at this very conference that a declaration was made about the formation of the All-India Scheduled Castes Federation. Below are given the exact words of the concluding part of this historic speech of Baba Sahib, as cited in his 'fascinating biography' authored by Dhananjay Keer:

"My final words of advice to you are educate, agitate and organize; have faith in yourself. With justice on our side, I do not see how we can lose our battle. The battle to me is a matter of joy. The battle is in the fullest sense spiritual. There is nothing material or social in it. For ours is a battle, not for wealth or for power. It is a battle for freedom. It is a battle for the reclamation of human personality" (Bombay: Popular Prakashan, 3rd ed. 1971, p: 351, emphasis added).

Baba Sahib' struggle for the uplift of the socially excluded was precisely spiritual in the sense that it intends to restore their lost dignity and make them equal with all the other sections of the rest of the society. For that the method he chooses was democratic-constitutional. Being educated in the oldest democracies in the world, Dr. Ambedkar imbibed the true spirit of democracy and constitutionalism. He wanted his fellow -beings and his countrymen to follow democratic ways for the peaceful resolution of all one problems including the most fatal one - the Untouchability.

In his democratic scheme of conflict resolution, education figures at the very beginning of the social struggle. Hence "educate" comes first in his three stepped slogan of educate, agitate and organize. By education Baba Sahib did not mean merely certificates and degrees. For him to educate means to become aware of ones real life conditions; to be conscious of ones surroundings; to raise objection to the inhuman existence in the society; and to ask for change for the better. "Tell the slaves he is a slave and he will revolt", that is the real meaning of education.

It is such education that will stir agitation within, leading to what Baba Sahib called "agitate". To "agitate" does not mean to organize guerrilla warfare, to do Murdabad - Murdabad. On the contrary, it means to become aware about ones social conditions and to seek viable steps for the eradication of the causes of the problems. Baba Sahib told us that only real and true education could only make us to "agitate".

And it is this agitation, which is within, that would ultimately help us to "organize". The true example of which is Baba Sahib himself, who after obtaining critical and rational sense through his education felt toofan within and consequently organized three political parties (Independent Labor Party, Scheduled Caste Federation and Republican Party of India) to secure Dalit human rights.

**Thus the real sequence of the slogan is:
Educate Agitate and Organize.**

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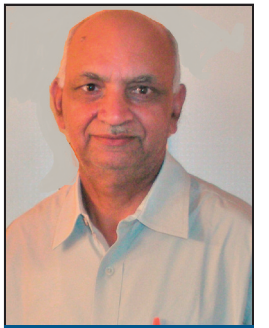
Historic Event of Unveiling of 'Statue of Equality' in Maryland, USA

An enthusiastic gathering of more than 500 Ambedkarites from different parts of the world witnessed the unveiling of the monumental 19-foot sculpture of Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar, at a colourful ceremony held in Maryland, USA on 14 October, 2023. "The Statue of Equality", is the artistic creation by the famous sculptor Ram Sutar.

The event was organised under the aegis of The Ambedkar International Center, Maryland Washington, D.C. The distinguished guests, community leaders, scholars, and activists, gathered paid rich tributes to Dr. Ambedkar's enduring legacy despite heavy rains. It carries a profound message of unity, equality, and the fight against oppression, making it an emblem of hope and inspiration for all.

This largest statue of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, erected outside India, is a potent emblem of his lofty ideals of social justice, human rights, and equality. It was also an opportunity to ponder on the enduring legacy of Baba Sahib and the continued relevance of his principles in our collective pursuit of a fairer, more inclusive society.

Dr. Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar, often referred to as Babasaheb and Bodhisattva, was a champion of social

justice, equality, and the rights of marginalized communities. The principal architect of India's Constitution, Babasaheb occupies an esteemed place in India's historical and social landscape. He was the crusader for the upliftment of the downtrodden and underprivileged sections of Indian society. His ideology and enduring legacy continued to inspire generations, particularly in the context of his unwavering commitment to social equality, combat caste-based discrimination and empowerment of women through education.

Dr Bhim Rao Ambedkar, was born on 14 April, 1891 into a most disadvantaged community. Despite facing unimaginable disabilities, he carved his way to reach the very pinnacle of human existence. As a young Ambedkar, he had the opportunity to study in the Columbia University, USA; London School of Economics, UK and University of Bonn in Germany. During his stay in the US, he learned about the racial discrimination and witnessed its effects. He was well-versed in the intellectual discourse of his time and, as an activist-scholar, established connections with key figures. Dr. Ambedkar's love for books was remarkable; he collected 2,000 books during his stay at

Columbia University, despite facing financial challenges. During the roundtable conference in London in 1931, he brought 32 boxes of books, and when he built his residence 'Rajgriha', his library contained an astonishing 50,000 books. This intellectual breadth establishes Dr. Ambedkar a global thinker.

From his early 20s, he was an influential voice and became more and more influential. Dr. Ambedkar urged women not to allow themselves to be forced into marriage and to stand up to their husbands as equals. He played a pivotal role in social movements advocating for the rights of untouchables in India.

He was the chairman of the Constituent Assembly's most crucial Drafting Committee that earned him the moniker Architect of the Indian Constitution. Post-Independence, he became the Minister of Law & Justice in Jawaharlal Nehru's first Cabinet. Ambedkar played a key role in social movements that fought for the rights of Dalits and untouchables. Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, as a legislator fought for upliftment of women through education. It was a remarkable feminist thinking that could be considered as progressive even for the current generation of politicians. He embraced Bud-

dism on October 14, 1956 and the day is celebrated as Dhamma Chakra Parivartan Divas. Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar breathed his last on December 6, 1956. The privileged gathering in this glittering ceremony, was greeted by revered Buddhist monk Bhante Revata. The function began with the chanting of 'Buddham Sharanam Gachchhami' and Buddhist prayers. Mr. Bhante Revata and his colleagues addressed the gathering. Mr. Ram Kumar Sherwal, President, Ambedkar International Center, Maryland welcomed the guests from all parts of the world. He termed the unveiling of the 'Statue of Equality' as a historic milestone. Though it is a small step but a giant leap for the 'struggle to equality'. He applauded the commitment and dedication for the exemplary achievement. It is a symbol of solidarity with the ongoing struggle for human rights and social justice, not just in India but across the world. It is a significant and commendable step that reflects the global recognition of Dr. Ambedkar's monumental legacy.

This momentous event is expected to reinvigorate the global justice movement, inspire marginalized (Contd. on next page)

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communities, and provide a platform for oppressed people to come together in solidarity. It is a historic moment for all the Ambedkarites/Buddhists and members of Ravidasiya community across the globe particularly living in the diaspora in different parts of the United States of America. Chris Van Hollen, United States Senator said in his message that today, as we unveil this statue, we not only celebrate his legacy but also reaffirm our commitment to those principles that Dadasaheb stood for.

Thereafter, a session of Academic Presentations was held in which renowned scholars like Dr. Parin Somani, Prof. Jeremy Rinker, Saswathi Natta and Prof. Malini Ranganathan summarised their research findings on the life and works of Babasaheb. Jeremy A Rinker, PhD is an Associate Professor of Peace and Conflict Studies at the University of North Carolina Greensboro, USA. He has made researches in the intersections between narrative and nonviolent social change. Working with marginalised communities to create the spaces and structures to address all types of violence (structural, cultural, and direct), resist injustice, and develop platforms for social resilience to blossom and grow. Jeremy's book, Identity, Rights, and Awareness: Anti-caste Activism in India and the Awakening of Justice through Discursive Practices (Conflict Resolution and Peacebuilding in Asia) (Lexington) has been published in October 2018. A provocative study of the narrative agency of contemporary anti-caste movements in India, Identity, Rights, and Awareness makes the narratives of historically marginalised anti-caste activists audible to activists and academics alike.

Madam Saswathi Natta is a Social Scientist and Scholar-Activist. She is working on her doctoral dissertation which seeks to examine the impact of Brahminical patriarchy (intersection of caste and gender) on the lives of rural Indian women. Malini Ranganathan is Associate Professor in the School of International Service at American University and a political ecologist and geographer. Most broadly, she is a scholar of urban environmental justice interested in the political economy of land, labor, and ecology in the capitalist city. She researches environmental casteism and environmental racism in urban contexts, what she refers to as "environmental unfreedoms." Specifically, she studies how caste and racial histories shape segregated housing and property relations, water and sanitation access, and flood and climate vulnerability.

After the intellectual discourses, the gathering moved to the 'Statue of Babasaheb' for the unveiling ceremony despite heavy downpour. The statue of equality was unveiled by the AIC team led by Sh Ram Kumar. The participants then had a sumptuous lunch. In the afternoon, a colourful cultural programme by the Ambedkartartistic troupe was presented. The major attraction was the Dance/Drama of Dr. Ambedkar— A Play directed by Pradnya. Academy award nominee Ava

DurVernaysaid Dr. Ambedkar will feature in the Hollywood film 'Origin' made by her. The film is based on Isabel Wickerson's book Caste: The origins of our discontent and features Dr. Ambedkar.

Many Global Ambedkarites also shared their views on Babasaheb's life and works. On this auspicious occasion, some of the Organizations engaged in spreading the lofty principles of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar were also recognised for their contributions.
