REMEMBERING C.L. CHUMBER ON HIS 8TH ANNIVERSARY

We deeply remember Mr C. L. Chumber on his 8th anniversary. His valuable con-



tribution towards highlighting the importance of the Ad Dharm Movement for developing Dalit consciousness in Punjab has generated a lot of interest not only in Punjab but in other parts of the country as well as among the diaspora. Mr. C. L. Chumber was one of the few Dalit activists who consistently worked for popularizing the legacy of Ad Dharm movement. He highlighted the contributions of Great Freedom Fighter Babu Mangu Ram Mugowalia towards the formation of Ad Dharm and the legacy of this historic Dalit movement in North-Western India. He launched Punjabi Monthly journal "Kaumi Udarian" (National Flights) to keep the legacy of the movement alive.

In 1985 he brought a well-documented "Babu Mangu Ram Muggowalia Souvenir" on the formation and achievements of the Ad Dharm movement and the sterling contribution of Babu Mangu Ram Mugowalia in awakening of self-respect among the Moolnivasees of the region. The title 'Mugowalia' after Mangu Ram Mugowalia, in fact was appended by Mr. C.L. Chumber. His legacy is being kept alive in the pages of two weeklies (Ambedkar Times in English and Desh Doaba in Panjabi) published from Sacramento (California) USA. Dr. Sunita Sawarkar, emerging scholar in history has recently published a book on *'Dhor - Chambhar (Chamar) Striyanchya Ambedkari Janiwancha Parigh*' a new dimension to the Ambedkarite study. The writer has microscopically focused on the role of women in Ambedkarite movement with special reference to Dhor and Chambhar women.

In her study she has taken a brief survey of budding women movement in different corners of Maharashtra. How different backward castes were raising their voices for Equality. Pre-Ambedkarite Mahar, Chambhar and Dhor women although on the periphery of the society but under the dominance of patriarchal mentality of Hindu religion.

The writer has studied the role of women in Pre, Post and contemporary Ambedkarite movement. The references regarding Cha. Rajarshi Shahu Maharaja and Sayajirao Gaikwad Maharaj and their visionary approach towards the progress of women in pre-independent India are quite impressive. The writer has also studied various undercurrents helping women in their progress.

There are 4 chapters, concluding and appendages in the book. First chapter is Tracing History of Untouchable Women second is Personal and Social life of Dhor-Chambhar Women, third one chapter is References to Dhor - Chambhar women in Ambedkarite Movement and last chapter is Introduction to Dhor-Chambhar Women's personal life. First chapter of the book is very important to understand history of Pre Ambedkarite Untouchable women, Untouchable saint women like Saint Kallyanamma (Chambhar) Saint Soyarabai (Mahar) Saint Nirmla (Mahar) Saint Bhagubai (Mahar), Saint Santabai (Chambhar) Untouchable women & Satyashodhak Movement, Untouchable women & Nirashreet-Sevasadan, Untouchable women, Bahishkrut Movement Untouchable women & Upper Caste Reformer.

Malanbai Waghmare & Kamal Parkhe also from common background. They worked in Dalit Panther, Dalit Yuwak Aghadi and Renaming Movement. Kashibai Jadhav, Urmila Raimane, Baby Mukane, Kesharabai Ghumare also contributed in Ambedkarite movement at various stages

The book helps to study and raise our curiosity regarding the role of these women in the Ambedkarite movement. Well known creative writer and activist Urmila Pawar has covered the



Paying Tribute to Mata Ramabai Bhimrao Ambedkar

(February 7, 1898 – May 27, 1935)
on her Birth Anniversary

Ramabai Bhimrao Ambedkar (February 7, 1898 – May 27, 1935) was the first wife of Babasaheb Dr. B. R Ambedkar. She had been married to him for 29 years. She passed away on May 27,



1935, after a prolonged illness, at Rajgruha, Bombay. She was not only a homemaker but also played a significant role in facilitating Dr. Ambedkar to pursue and attain higher education, which he recognised in one of his voluminous writings entitled Thoughts on Pakistan, published in 1941. Dr. B. R. Ambedkar dedicated this book to Ramabai. In the preface of the book he put on record that it was Ramabai who transformed him from an ordinary Bhima to Dr Ambedkar.

Ramabai has been remembered reverently by the followers and admirers of Babasaheb. She belonged to an ordinary family. She lost both her parents in very young age and had to abandon her native place, Mahapura locality within the village of Vanand near Dapoli Ratnagiri, along with her three sisters and a brother to live with her uncles Valangkar and Govindpurkar in Bombay in Byculla market. When Ramabai married Dr. Ambedkar in 1906, she was only eight years old and Ambedkar's age was 15 years. Ambedkar lovingly used to call her "Ramu" and she called him "Saheb". She gave birth to Yashwant, Gangadhar, Ramesh, Indu (daughter) and Rajratna. Except Yashwant (1912-1977), the other four children died in their childhood.

JAWAHAR LAL NEHRU

JAWAHARLAL NEHRU was a man of three extraordinary epochs. He was a leader in the long anticolonial struggle to free his own land and to inspire a fighting will in other lands under bondage.

He lived to see victory and to move then to another epochal confrontation - the fight for peace after World War II. In this climactic struggle he did not have Gandhi at his side, but he did have the Indian people, now free in their own great Republic.

It would be hard to overstate Nehru's and India's contributions in this period. It was a time fraught with the constant threat of a devastating finality for mankind. There was no moment in this period free from the peril of atomic war. In these years Nehru was a towering world force skillfully inserting the peace will of India between the raging antagonisms of the great powers of East and West.

The world needed a mediator and an 'honest broker' lest, in its sudden acquisition of overwhelming destructive force, one side or the other might plunge the world into mankind's last war. Nehru had the prestige, the wisdom, and the daring to play the role.

The markedly relaxed tensions of today are Nehru's legacy to us, and at the same time they are our monument to him.

It should not be forgotten that the treaty to end nuclear testing accomplished in 1963 was first proposed by Nehru. Let us also remember that the world dissolution of colonialism now speedily unfolding had its essential origins in India's massive victory. And let it also be remembered that Nehru guided into being the 'Asian-African Bloc' as a united voice for the billions who were groping toward a modern world. He was the architect of the policy of nonalignment which was calculated to give independent expression to the emerging nations while enabling them to play a constructive role in world affairs.

The third epoch of Nehru's work is unfolding

after his death. Even though his physical presence is gone, his spiritual influence retains a living force. The great powers are not yet in harmonious relationship to each other, but with the help of the nonaligned world they have learned to exercise a wise restraint. In this is the basis for a lasting detente. Beyond this, Nehru's example in daring to believe and act for peaceful co-existence gives mankind its most glowing hope.

In this period, the Negroes of the United States, have made strides toward freedom beyond all precedent in our history. Our successes directly derive from our employment of the tactics of non-violent direct action and non-cooperation with evil which Nehru effectively employed under Gandhi's inspiration.

The peculiar genius of imperialism was found in its capacity to de-

clude so much of the world into the belief that it was civilizing primitive cultures even though it was grossly exploiting them. Satyagraha made the myth transparent as it revealed the oppressed to be the truly civilized party. They rejected violence but maintained resistance, while the oppressor knew nothing but the use of violence.

My people found that Satyagraha, applied in the United States to our oppressors, also clarified who was right and who was wrong. On this foundation of truth as irresistible, a majority could be organized for just solutions.

Our fight is not yet won, just as the struggle against colonialism is still unfinished, and above all, the achievement of a stable peace still lies ahead of and not behind us.

In all of these struggles of mankind to rise to a true state of civilization, the towering figure of Nehru sits unseen but felt at all council tables. He is missed by the world, and because he is so wanted, he is a living force in the tremulous world of today.

AD DHARM IN PUNJAB ELECTIONS

Ad Dharm movement of Punjab gained tremendous importance within a short period after its foundation in 1926. That it got recognition for a separate religion for the so called lowest if the low from the British Government speaks about its great strength. In 1931, about 500, 000 Scheduled Castes (SCs) got recorded Ad Dharm as their distinct religion. Thereafter, its record victory in the 1937 Punjab Provincial Assembly elections reinforced its popularity among the SCs. Its victory in the 1946 Punjab Provincial Assembly election to the Punjab

Legislative Assembly assigned it an independent political identity. Babu Mangu Ram Mugowalia, the founder of the Ad Dharm movement, was elected from Hoshiarpur constituency. It contested both the above-mentioned assembly elections in collaboration with the Unionist Party. Babu Mangu Ram Mugowalia also contested the Punjab Legislative Assembly Election of 1951, but as an Independent contestant from the Garhshankar Constituency. He was offered a ticket by the Congress to contest the assembly elections as its nominee but Babu Mangu Ram Ji refused to contest the election on the Congress ticket and the same was given to Mr Kartar Singh of village Langeri of Hoshiarpur District.

Assemblyman Josh Hoover Introduces Legislation to Stop the Proliferation of Fentanyl in Schools



Assemblyman Hoover

SACRAMENTO - Today, Assemblyman Josh Hoover (R-Folsom) announced the introduction of groundbreaking legislation to address the alarming rise of fentanyl in California schools and communities. Assembly Bill 2045 would increase penalties on fentanyl crimes involving minors and add sentence enhancements for criminals who traffick fentanyl within 1,000 feet of school grounds.

"Our number one job as lawmakers should be protecting our most vulnerable from harm," Assemblyman Hoover said. "We must do more as a Legislature to create a safe environment where our children can learn, grow, and thrive. This bill sends a clear message that those who endanger minors and bring deadly fentanyl

into our schools will face severe consequences."

AB 2045 would classify fentanyl in the same category as other dangerous illicit drugs and would give prosecutors new tools to hold dealers accountable.

Key Provisions of the Proposed Legislation:

1. New penalties on the sale of fentanyl to children: The bill seeks to add an additional 2 years to the sentence of any adult who solicits, induces, encourages, or intimidates a minor with the intent that the minor commits a drug crime. If passed, this felony offense will be punishable by 5, 8, or 11 years in state prison.

2. Sentence enhancement for fentanyl-related offenses on or near school grounds: Brings fentanyl in

line with other drugs like heroin or cocaine in cases where the offense occurs upon or within 1,000 feet of school grounds by adding a 2-year enhancement to the sentence of those who solicit, encourage, or intimidate minors to commit these drug crimes. This enhancement aims to create a safer environment for students attending public or private elementary, vocational, middle, or high schools during school hours or related programs.

3. Additional punishment for trafficking fentanyl on or near school grounds: Adds fentanyl to the list of illicit drugs already covered under state law for drug trafficking offenses on or near school premises. For adults committing specified drug trafficking offenses within 1,000 feet of a

school, the legislation adds an additional punishment of 3, 4, or 5 years. Furthermore, if the offense involves a minor who is at least four years younger than the defendant, an extra enhancement of 3, 4, or 5 years applies, subject to re-alignment.

Josh Hoover represents Assembly District 7, which includes the cities of Citrus Heights, Folsom, and Rancho Cordova and the unincorporated communities of Carmichael, Fair Oaks, Foothill Farms, Gold River, Mather, McClellan Park, North Highlands, Orangevale, and Rosemont.



The competition challenged students with on-the-spot topics related to painting, including themes such as 'Chandrayaan,' 'Success of India in Games,' and 'Mantras of De-
