

Gray's Inn unveils the Ambedkar Room and a new portrait of Dr Ambedkar, 30 June 2021

aster Ali Malek QC, Master Treasurer, Grav's Inn, unveiled the Ambedkar Room at Grav's Inn on 30 June 2021. The new room dedicated to Dr Ambedkar is the result of discussions over the years between Ms Santosh Dass MBE, President of the Federation of Ambedkarite and Buddhist Organisations UK (FABO UK) and Brigadier Anthony Harking OBE, Under Treasurer, at the Inn. The Ambedkar Room will be used by barristers in training and as a meeting room.

Master Ali Malek QC also unveiled a new portrait of Dr Ambedkar by David Newens, the Buckinghamshire- based artist. The portrait was donated by FABO UK for the Ambedkar Room and was unveiled in presence of Sujat Ambedkar- Dr Ambedkar's great-grandson. The new portrait commissioned by FABO UK in 2020, is based on a photo of Dr Ambedkar taken for LIFE magazine in May 1946 by the American Margaret Bourke-White (1904-1971). She was one of the most respected photojournalists of her time. David Newens's portrait shows Dr Ambedkar in a relaxed mood on a nation in the way he did without the capacity to dream. Dr Ambedkar was an agent for change. From today, he will be woven much deeper into the fabric of his Inn, reminding us that no challenge is insurmountable and that the law can be a vehicle for social evolution that may previously have been considered impossible. Today I am honoured to unveil the Ambedkar Room



and the graceful new portrait donated to the Inn by the Federation of Ambedkarite and Buddhist Organisations UK."

Ms Santosh Dass MBE said: For a number of years The Honourable Society of Gray's Inn and I discussed ways in which we could raise the profile of Dr. Ambedkar at Gray's Inn. Dr. Ambedkar was one of most educated people of his generation

Alumni of Gray's Inn, Ambedkarites, academics including Dr Suraj Yengde, and other distinguished guests took part at the reception hosted jointly by Gray's Inn and FABO UK. David Newens and the parliamentarian Lord David Alton of Liverpool also attended. Covid restrictions meant a larger event could not take place originally planned.

Master Ali Malek QC said: Today we proudly celebrate the connection Dr B. R. Ambedkar had to Gray's Inn. He could not have known that over half a century after his passing, his portraits would grace his Inn, that the Walks would boast a tree dedicated in his name, and people would gather to dedicate a room to his memory. Even for a man of his talents, that may have seemed too much - but one does not shape with degrees from India, America and Britain. He was a politician, socio-political reformer, economist, jurist and prolific writer. He inspired the Buddhist movement in India and was the chief architect of India's Constitution. It is therefore demeaning when he is merely reduced to a leader of the 'Untouchables'. He was much, much more than that. Dr. Ambedkar ought to be part of the British school curriculum. The social and economic reforms he passionately steered have helped change the lives of millions of people for the better. Dr Ambedkar believed in good and fair laws. He believed in secular society. We can imagine his outrage at the draconian laws that are being liberally used by the Indian Government now to incarcerate without bail, academics (including Dr Anand Teltumbde), human rights activists who raise their voice against atrocities against minorities or corruption, and the lawyers who defend them.

I am confident the new Ambedkar Room and the new portrait donated today by FABO UK will arouse legal students' curiosity to look into, and learn about Dr. Ambedkar's accomplishments.



Lord David Alton of Liverpool said: "It is remarkable, and highly instructive, just how frequently Dr B. R. Ambedkar is still referred to during debates in both Houses of Parliament – not least when we have deliberated the rank discrimination still experienced by Dalits and Adivasis, or issues such as modern slavery and human trafficking, and the plight of persecuted minorities.

The story of Dr Ambedkar's life represents a route out of enforced misery into to emancipation, justice, and equality. The life of this extraordinary man continues to offer hope and encouragement to millions of downtrodden people, living on the periphery of society because of caste or stigmatisation.

Gray's Inn's decision to dedicate a new portrait and room to his memory is a wonderful way of introducing him to generations yet to come and we should also take other opportunities – such as an annual conference, marking Dr Ambedkar's birth anniversary, perhaps hosted by the All Party Parliamentary Group on Dalits - to explore the many facets of this wonderful man's heroic life."

Sujat Ambedkar said: "I am delighted to be here at Gray's Inn to witness this historic unveiling of the new Ambedkar Room and the new portrait for the room donated by the Federation of Ambedkarite and Buddhist Organisations UK. It makes us very happy to see the new painting of our great-grandfather looking very relaxed and happy in his beloved garden at his home in New Delhi in 1946. His love of bougainvillea's magenta pink form is family lore. We are grateful to Gray's Inn and FABO UK for this unique honour that marks his 130th birth anniversary. Our great-grandfather was a remarkable man who helped change for the better the lives of millions of people in India. He continues to inspire millions more around the world. The Ambedkar Room and the new portrait will no doubt inspire many more to learn about him."

Dr Suraj Yengde, Harvard University, and University of Oxford said, "Barrister Ambedkar was a fearless, fierce fighter. His career as a lawyer was noteworthy in that he could have easily become the luminous judge occupying the highest office of court in the state. But Barrister Ambedkar instead utilized his legal training to practice with merit and argue for justice. His diverse clientele is a proof of his successful legal career. FABO's organizing efforts have been inspirational to many and especially me. With another London landmark bequeathed to Ambedkar's story, an archive for the pilgrims has been inaugurated. The believers in Ambedkar's idea of caste free society and democratic equality will find a sought-after shrine in this august space at Gray's Inn. Like the LSE, where I just participated in a panel on Dr. Ambedkar and witnessed the inauguration of his archive, London Ambedkar is an important city in the history of the Dalit struggle."

Mr Arun Kumar and C Gautam, Joint Secretaries of FABO UK said:

"FABO UK's members' association with Gray's Inn spans over half a century. In 1991, under the auspices of FABO UK, the Ambedkar Centenary Celebrations Committee organised a reception at Gray's Inn. It was a marvellous event that lives in our memories still. Since then, FABO UK's association with the Inn has grown. In 1999, we were grateful when the Inn allowed the filming of the Gray's Inn scenes in the film Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar (2000). Today we express our deepest appreciation

to The Honourable Society of Gray's Inn for the new Ambedkar Room. We had hoped it, and the new portrait could have been unveiled in 2020. That would have marked the centenary of Dr Ambedkar's return to Gray's Inn."

Dr Ambedkar at Gray's Inn

Dr. Bhimrao R. Ambedkar (14 April 1891–6 December 1956) is known internationally as an extraordinary academic, writer, politician, socio-political reformer, economist, and jurist. He also inspired the Buddhist movement in India. As the chief architect of India's Constitution, he abolished Untouchability, and secured social and fundamental legal rights and equality for its citizens. As India's Minister of Labour under the Viceroy's Executive Council, between 1942 and 1946 he secured significant legal protections for workers including a reduction in factory working hours, compulsory recognition by employers of Trade Unions, a requirement for settlement of industrial disputes and a minimum wage. He also secured maternity benefits and equal pay for equal work for working women. He was independent India's first Minister of Law and Justice. With the Hindu Code Bill, he helped pioneer reforms that abolished polygamy, gave women the right to divorce, and the right to inherit property.

Dr Ambedkar spent two periods study at Gray's Inn whilst also studying at the London School of Economics and Political Science. The first stint was from October 1916 to July 1917 – straight after he had completed his studies at Columbia University. Unfortunately, his studies in London were cut short when the Diwan ('Minister') of the State of Baroda (present-day Gujarat) recalled Dr Ambedkar to India because his scholarship had ended. The second stint began when Dr Ambedkar returned to London in July 1920. This time he relied on his savings, supplemented by Ioans. He was called at the Inn in June 1922.

Two portraits of Dr Ambedkar already hang at the Inn. The Ambedkar Memorial Committee of GB donated the first one in 1974. The Government of India donated the second in 2016 to mark Dr Ambedkar's 125th birth anniversary. The 2016 portrait features on the back cover of Gray's Inn book An Illustrated History of Gray's Inn (2018) alongside the portraits of eleven other distinguished alumnus of the Inn. A short biography Dr Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar and the Indian Constitution' under 1947 is contained in the same publication.

There is an Indian bean tree (Catalpa bignonioides) in The Walks dedicated to Dr. Ambedkar. The then-High Commissioner of India to the UK, Mr L. M. Singhvi donated to the Inn in 1997.

In 1991 one of the Ambedkar Centenary Celebrations Committee's receptions under the auspicious of FABO UK was held at Gray's Inn. Lord Goff of Chieveley called Dr Ambedkar the "Moses of India". Mr Anthony Scrivener, Chairman of the Bar said: "To honour Dr Ambedkar is to honour the importance of dignity of each human life, for it was he who fought for equality for the under privileged, for the poor and for the forgotten."

The Gray's inn scenes in Jabber Patel's 2000 film Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar were filmed at the Inn and FABO UK supported this.

The Ambedkar Room unveiled on 30 June 2021 is the culmination of Gray's Inn and FABO UK working together for a number of years on ways to raise the profile of Dr. Ambedkar at Gray's Inn, and more generally in Britain.

The new portrait commissioned and donated by the FABO UK by David Newens based on a 1946 photo by the American photojournalist, Margaret Bourke-White now hangs in the Ambedkar Room at Gray's Inn.

For a number of years, I discussed with The Honourable Society of Gray's Inn ways in which we could raise the profile of Dr Ambedkar who trained as a barrister at the Inn in 1916 and from 1921 to 1922 while concurrently studying for a Master's degree at the London School of Economics. There was already a portrait of Dr Ambedkar at the Inn, donated in 1974 by the Ambedkar Memorial Committee of GB, and an Indian bean tree (Catalpa bignonioides) in The Walks donated by the then-High Commissioner of India in 1997. The Government of India donated a further portrait in 2016. Over the years we discussed a number of proposals and decided on naming a room after Dr Ambedkar which would give those who used its space an introduction to the great man, and maybe arouse their curiosity to look into and learn from his remarkable life, works and accomplishments. The Ambedkar Room, was unveiled by Mr Ali Malek QC, Master Treasurer, The Honourable Society of Gray's Inn on 30 June 2021 to mark the centenary of Dr Ambedkar's return to Gray's Inn in 1921. FABO UK commissioned and donated artist David Newens' new portrait of Dr Ambedkar for the Ambedkar Room. This also marks Dr Ambedkar's 130th birth anniversary. Bourke-White Margaret Lange and Lee Miller, she shattered gender role stereotypes. Passionate about the natural world, as she wrote in Portrait of Myself (1963), she turned down an offer from New York's Museum of Natural History because photography crooked its lucrative finger.

Bourke-White lived through many an epochal historical event. She was the witness in situ with cameras, lighting equipment, tripods and an unswerving eye. She captured the Depression-era, its Dust Bowl victims and chain gangs, and its poverty and New Deal hopefuls. The Soviet Union granted her permission to document the Five Year Plan's progress during the summers of 1930 to 1932. When the Nazis marched into the Sudetenland in 1938, she was there. Likewise in the Soviet Union when the Nazis tore up the non-aggression pact. She photographed Stalin, saw newly liberated Buchenwald, and witnessed the Partition of the Raj.

Between 1946 and 1947 Bourke-White lived and travelled in India. On assignment for Life, she photographed Dr. Ambedkar, Gandhi, Jinnah and Nehru. Bourke-White's portrait of Dr. Ambedkar was taken in May 1946. Unlike his usual formal patrician poses, her photo shoot captured him in relaxed mood. He is at home at 26 Alipur Road, Civil Lines, Delhi on his veranda with a cascade of bougainvillea beside him. Family lore recalls his love of bougainvillea's magenta pink form.

David Newens

David Newens (b 1945) is a noted portraitist in oils. He paints from life or, as with his commission from Commonwealth Parliamentary Association to paint its former Secretary General, William Ferdinand Shija, posthumously from photographs. The original image selected of Dr. Ambedkar was one of a sequence Margaret Bourke-White shot now in the LIFE Picture Collection. Its monochrome bougainvillea enabled Newens to deploy another side of his artistic palette. Two of his 'Greenhouse Interior' floral scenes were hung at succeeding years' Royal Academy Summer Exhibitions.

The Federation's key aim is to raise awareness of Dr Ambedkar's life, works and achievements. It also lobbies for Caste-based discrimination to be outlawed in Britain; raises its voice on issues relating to equality and against human rights violations and atrocities against Dalits; and for 14 April (Dr Ambedkar's birth date) to be recognised as 'International Day of Equality'.

FABO UK raises awareness of Dr Ambedkar by making donations of busts and statues of Dr Ambedkar and his writings, as well as organising and hosting conferences, including ones in the both Houses of the Parliament. In 1992,

FABO UK donated busts of Dr Ambedkar to the High Commission of India in London, the London School of Economics, Columbia University New York, and Simon Fraser University in Vancouver. In 2018, the Federation donated a life-size statute of Dr Ambedkar to the Ambedkar Museum, London. Over the years the Federation has donated

hundreds of sets of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar, Writings and Speeches to universities and organisations, including Gray's Inn, universities in Oxford, Cambridge, Bonn and Paris, and both Houses of Parliament. During the Ambedkar Centenary Celebrations in

1991 under the auspices of FABO UK, a number of events were organised in such prestigious venues as both Parlia-Houses of ment, LSE, the Gray's Inn, and the Commonwealth Hall. In 1991 FABO UK installed a blue plaque outside 10 King Henry's Road, near Primrose

Hill in London, NW3

where Dr Ambedkar had lived in the early 1920s. After the property came on the market, in September 2014 FABO UK submitted a proposal to the Government of Maharashtra (GOM) that they fund its purchase in order to turn it into a memorial. After a year of lobbying, GOM bought the house in 2015. It is now officially the Ambedkar Museum. The Ambedkar Room at Gray's Inn is the culmination of discussions with Gray's Inn. We acknowledge their generous and wholehearted support.

abasaheb B.R. Ambedkar, the greatest son of contemporary India, an economist, constitutional pundit, social reformer and father of the Indian constitution and one of the prominent exponents of the lofty values of 'Equality, Justice, Liberty and Fraternity', of late, consciously or otherwise, has increasingly become a personality who is much commemorated and celebrated not only in India but in the world at large. 

Ambedkar Memorial at Alipur Road in Delhi - The memorial was inaugurated on 14 April 2018. The site signifies the fact that Babasaheb Ambedkar lived in bunglow no.26 at Alipur Road in Delhi before his nirvana on December 6, 1956. Prime Minister Narendra Modi while laying the foundation of the memorial and remembering the social, political and economic contributions of Babasaheb said that it would be injustice to limit Babasaheb to a particular class. PM Atal Bihari Vajpayee had decided to convert the site into a memorial in honour of Babasaheb.

Apart from Panchatirth, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the Ambedkar Memorial in London on November 14, 2015 where Dr. Ambedkar used to stay while studying in London. It is not just for nothing Ambedkar's statues, busts and other insignia are coming up in the important capitals and important cities globally namely; UK, USA, Canada, Australia, Japan, Hungary, Vietnam, Ghana, South Africa, inter alia. Many of the renowned Schools, Colleges and Universities have already established libraries and chairs in honour of Dr. Ambedkar not only in India but also abroad. 

Record-smashing temperatures in Canada and USA: a wake-up call

In the last week of June, an extreme heat wave has killed at least 600 people in Canada. Of those killed, 486 were from British Columbia alone. Most of the dead were elderly people living alone. Generally, the weather in British Columbia is not too hot but very pleasant during the summer months. The average temperature here is close to 20 to 25 degree Celsius, that is why people are not tolerant of heat. The weather is cold for most of the year, so people do not have air conditioning or ventilation in their homes. As a result, most people have died from suffocation in extreme heat. Some people have also died due to heat wave in the other Canadian states of Ontario, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and Quebec. The exact number of deaths is not yet known. The sudden rise in temperature in Canada has alerted all the countries of the world that climate change will not come in the distant future but in the present they are facing adversity of climate change in the form of natural disasters. On June 29, Lytton, a small town in the Canadian province of British Columbia, had a recordsmashing temperature of 49.6 degree Celsius. The town is located on 50 degree latitude north of the equator. while the temperature in Delhi, the capital of India, was 43 degree Celsius on the same day, which is located 28 degree latitude on the north of equator. In addition, Lytton's temperature has been higher than that of the southwestern states of the United States. The average June temperature in the town of Lytton hovered around 24-25 degree Celsius, but on June 29, 2021, it doubled, which is responsible for deaths.

Northwestern cities in Canada as well as the United States are experiencing heat waves these days. Portland and Seattle experienced record-smashing temperatures of 46 degree Celsius and 42 degree Celsius respectively. The northwestern cities of Canada and the United States, such as Vancouver, Surrey, Seattle, and Portland, typically have temperatures of 11 to 22 degree Celsius in summer, so their residents do not even need fans. All these cities are known for their pleasant weather. Eleven states in the northwestern United States have been hit by drought due to low rainfall and rising temperatures. Water is declining rapidly in reservoirs and the risk of wildfires due to drought is also increasing. With the rise of global warming, all kinds of natural disasters are on the rise. The Arctic circle region also experienced a record temperature of 48 degree Celsius in the last week of June. Thus, above-average temperatures in the northern region indicate an increasing influx of heat waves.

What is a 'heat wave'? In the plains, when the temperature crosses 40 degree Celsius or 5 to 6 degree Celsius above the average temperature, the winds blowing there are called 'heat waves' and if it rises above 6 or 7 degrees Celsius above the average temperature, they are

called 'severe heat waves'. When the temperature in coastal areas rises from 37 degree Celsius and in mountainous areas 30 degree Celsius by 5 degree Celsius, those areas are considered to be under the influence of heat waves. According to the US Environmental Protection Agency, the arrival of heat waves in major US cities has been growing rapidly since the 1960s. In the 1960s, there were two heat waves every year, but in the 2010s the number increased to six. In recent years, the average heatwave in major urban areas has been about four days long. This is about a day longer than the average heatwave in the 1960s. The average heat wave season across the 50 major US cities is 47 days longer now than it was in the 1960s. According to a study by Stephen Leah, millions of people in the United States could experience

been the second warmest year so far despite the Corona pandemic and the La-Nina process as greenhouse gases already released into the atmosphere continue to heat it up.

According to the National Center for Atmospheric Research (NCAR), the temperatures in the upper 2000 meters of the ocean hit a record high in 2020. hottest years for the upper ocean have all occurred since 2015. About 90 per cent of the heat generated by human activities is absorbed by the oceans, which in turn increases ocean temperatures. Rising ocean water temperatures are affecting a variety of natural climatic processes, such as El-Nino, La-Nina, and ocean currents. Rising ocean water temperatures are increasing the number of cyclones and hurricanes and the depth of their impact. Rising temperPublic transport systems should be made as efficient as in Eurocountries. pean New brands of cars should be replaced by public transport (trains, trams. and buses). Forest cover should be increased rapidly. country Every should refrain from cutting down



dense forests and planting commercial crops in the name of economic development because commercial crops sometimes do not match the natural resources such as availability of wind and water of the region. Secondly, they cannot absorb as much greenhouse gases as trees do. Even when planting forests or trees, only local varieties of trees of the area should be planted as they are suitable for conserving the natural resources of the area and not any tree should be planted under any kind of commercial calculations. In the state of California in the United States, Eucalyptus trees are planted all over the places although these trees are suitable for swampy areas, not droughtprone areas. One of the reasons responsible for drought conditions in the California state of the United States is the planting of Eucalyptus trees in place of trees suitable to the local climatic conditions.

We must also change our living, eating, and drinking habits to control the rise in temperature. The animals we raise to eat meat are warming the environment by releasing carbon dioxide as well as other greenhouse gases like methane. There is also a growing trend among people to keep pets (dogs, cats) which is an unnatural phenomenon. In addition to releasing carbon dioxide and methane gases, these pets are also unbalancing the natural food chains and environmental management. To avoid the adverse effects of heat waves, we need to build homes, and buildings of offices and other workplaces in such a way that they require minimal energy to keep them cool and warm.

Newly built large numbers of buildings with exterior walls made of glass need air conditioning and hot air to keep them cool and warm, which play an important role in raising the temperature. Leaders and young people of all the countries need to be guided by this 'heat wave' in Canada and the United States and the sudden deaths caused by this 'heat wave' in which the elderly were among the dead. Leaders of all the countries should make such plans for the reduction of greenhouse gases at the Parties Conference — 26 in Glasgow and implement them so seriously that they can really control the rising temperature. Young people should also rise above the blind race of crass individualism and acute materialism and not leave the old parents to the mercy of nature.



extreme heat in the next 20 years. The 'heat wave' of June 2021 has broken all the previous records. In many places the temperature during the heatwave is 10 to 20 degree Celsius higher than the average temperature.

Richard Bann, a meteorologist with the National Weather Service's Weather Prediction Center, has explained that the heatwave was caused by two pressure systems, one coming from the Aleutian Islands in Alaska and other from James Bay and Hudson Bay in Canada. Over the last few decades, temperatures in the western part of the Pacific Ocean have been rising faster than those in the eastern hemisphere, causing warmer winds to blow instead of cold air coming from the ocean toward the earth. According to the organization, such a situation does not occur often, it occurs only once in two or three decades.

An IPCC 2014 report made it clear that unless greenhouse gas emissions are rapidly reduced, no country in the world would be spared from the adverse effects of global warming in the near future. Climate change will gradually take over all the places in the world from small islands to large continents, and from poor to rich countries. The average temperature of the earth is now 1 degree Celsius higher than the Pre-Industrial Revolution Period. The years succeeding 2014 have been the warmest years. The year 2020 has

atures are also affecting seafood systems, leading to a shortage of nutrients for marine animals. As a result, coastal areas are becoming more vulnerable to changing climate as well as ocean-related natural disasters, with sea levels rising rapidly as temperatures rise. As many as 237 million people in six countries (China, Vietnam, Thailand, Indonesia, Bangladesh, and India) on the Asian continent will be affected by floods each year by 2030, as many people in these countries live in coastal areas.

The issue of global warming has long been a topic of discussion at various international conferences, but developed countries have been slow to take it seriously because they thought that they will save their countries and people from the evils of the global warming with their money power, but now it is clear to them that measures will have to be taken to prevent it.

The Prime Minister of Canada and the President of the United States have expressed concern over the heat wave in Canada and the United States and called for precautionary measures. The rise in temperature is due to the emission of greenhouse gases, mainly from use of coal and oil. That is why all the countries of the world need to generate energy from natural sources like wind, water, and sun without wasting time so that the emission of greenhouse gases can be reduced rapidly.

My Struggle in Life

Malviya had collected outside the Lahore Railway Station, waiting for the arrival of the Simon Commission. Our group was led by the veteran leader Baba Kharak Singh. As the members of the commission emerged from the railway station, repeated shouts of "Simon, go back" rent the air. The members of the commission were smiling as they sped in their cars.

Lajpat Rai was in the forefront of the huge crowds while Madan Mohan Malviya was somewhat behind. There was commotion in the frontlines, and it soon spread all over. Malviya was seen rushing toward the place where Lajpat Rai was. A word went round that Lajpat Rai had been given lathi (big stick) blows by the deputy inspector general of police Scott. After some scuffle and argument, the crowds started dispersing as desired by the leaders, shouting, "Simon, go back."

In the evening, a protest meeting, which was attended by me also, was held outside the Mori Gate. Lajpat Rai spoke with vehemence. Turning to the pressmen and the plainclothed C.I.D. (Criminal Inves tigative Department) people, he asked them to take down and said, "Every lathi blow hurled at me is a nail in the coffin of the British empire." Dr. Gopi Chand Bhargava, who had also received some blows at the hands of the police, was equally forth right in condemning the incident. After about three weeks, Lajpat Rai died. It was said his death was due to the injuries caused by the lathi blows.

One afternoon, senior superintendent of police, Saunders, was shot dead as he came out of the office situated just opposite the DAV College. It was generally believed that he was mistaken for Scott who had assaulted Lajpat Rai. His two bodyguards, constables Chanan Singh and another, who chased the killers, were also shot dead near the gate of the college as they did not heed the warning to get away for their lives. The assailants escaped through the college hostel's back

door. We, the boarders of the hostel, were kept awake almost throughout the night when every article of each of us was searched by the police. No incriminating article or material was, however, recovered.

Then came the throwing of a bomb in the Central Assembly Hall while the assembly was in session. Next morning, the newspapers gave the names of the persons who were responsible for throwing the bomb as Bhagat Singh and Batu Keswar Dutt. Their photos also appeared in the progovernment local daily newspaper-Civil and Military Gazette. As these two young men threw the bomb, they shouted the revolutionary slogans, "Long live, revolution," "Down with British Imperialism." There was unprecedented running helter- skelter by the persons in the hall. But the bomb was not aimed at causing any physical harm to anybody; it was meant to be only a warning to the alien rulers to guit the country as the two young men asserted. They did not try to run away, which they could have easily done; rather, they voluntarily offered themselves for arrest. With this occurrence, Bhagat Singh shot into prominence and symbol of aspirations.


The investigation of the case led to the unearthing of the so-far unsolved mystery of the killing of Saunders and consequently, Bhagat Singh, Rajguru, and Sukhdev were arrested in that case and were eventually put on trial for the murder. Bhagat Singh had emerged as a national hero, and his name became a household word throughout the country. The trial created a great sensation, and all the newspapers gave large coverage, column after column, to the reporting of the court proceedings of the case, and the eagerly awaiting public read the proceedings with gusto, so to say. Everybody was anxious to have a glimpse of Bhagat Singh, and so was I. The trial was held in the Borstal jail adjoining the central jail before the special magistrate

Sri Krishan, brought for the purpose from the North-West Frontier Province. Only a few visitors, about ten in number, were allowed daily to watch the trial, and this too was on a selective

basis. One winter morning, I was also allowed to witness the trial. It was in fact the fulfilment of the long-cherished desire to see Bhagat Singh and his associates. Bhagat Singh was clean shaven except that he wore a well-trimmed moustache. He donned a cap and khadi (home spun cotton) clothes. He has indeed a charming personality. Before the trial proceedings would begin, Bhagat Singh and his co-accused used to sing in chorus a song composed by Ram Prasad Bismal, who was also a great revolutionary and had died on the gallows.

The refrain of the song was Sar faroshi ki tamanna ab hamare dil men hai, dekhna hai zor kitna bazu-e qatil men hai. (Now all that we wish is to sacrifice our lives for the sake of the motherland; let us see how much strength and capacity the cruel hands of the killers have.) It was a soul-stirring song.

After a protracted and dramatic trial before a special tribunal, which had seen several eventful phases, the three revolutionaries Bhagat Singh, Rajguru, and Sukhdev-were sentenced to death. Frantic efforts were made by the people all over the country as well as by national leaders including Mahatma Gandhi to save their lives. At one stage, great hopes were raised that death sentences would be commuted into sentences to transportation for life. In spite of all the efforts the three young men were hanged in the Lahore Central Jail in the evening and their bodies were taken away stealthily. The news of the hanging spread throughout the city like a wildfire. In no time, large crowds of people collected outside the Shah-e-Almi Gate and were shouting, "March to the central jail." The mother of Bhagat Singh, father Sardar Kishan Singh, and sister Bibi Amar Kaur were moving about in a car among the crowds, pacifying the agitated and angry mob. In those days, I was also putting up in Parimahal inside the Shah-e-Almi Gate where the offices of the All India Congress and the Yuvak Sewak Dal were situated. How many people went without evening meals, and how many without sleep for the night! People were weeping bitterly-their hero was no more. The bodies were stealthily taken to Hussainiwala on the other side of the



bank of river Satluj and hurriedly half cremated there.

Now samadhis (tombstones) of the great patriots stand on the site. The grateful nation remembers them by holding a fair there every year on the day they kissed the hangman's noose—the 23 March 1931. They made the supreme sacrifice to break the shackles of the motherland. This is the only way we pay our homage to them:

Shahidon Ki Chitaon par lagenge har baras mele, Watan par mitne walon ka yihi baqi nishan hoga. (Big fairs shall be held every year on the grounds sanctified by the cremations of the martyrs, and this alone shall be the memorial signifying the commemoration of the memory of the brave sons who had laid down their lives in the service of the motherland.)

A young man used to come for days together and stand against a wall near the place where Saunders was shot dead just opposite the office gate of the DAV College with a cloth bag hung over his shoulders.

He would sing:


Bharat Mata Pukardi Bhagat Singh Piyaria, Piwange tera khun we phansi to chaarhan walia.

(O, beloved Bhagat Singh, Mother India is lamenting aloud in anguish and grimly vows to take bloody revenge on those who sent you to the gallows.)

On hearing him sing in a voice full of melody and pathos, students of the college and the passersby would collect round about and hear him sing in so touching a manner that tears would well up in their eyes.

Those were the sensational days of great sufferings and sacrifices, and all this at the altar of Bharat-Mata (Mother India).
