
Paying floral tribute to

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. on his Birth Anniversary

Dr. Martin Luther King was to America what Babasaheb Dr. B.R. Ambedkar and Mahatma Gandhi were to India. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was born on January 15, 1929 in the illustrious family of pastors of the Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, where his grandfather and father served, and he himself served as co-pastor until his assassination on April 4, 1968. Originally, he was named Michael Luther King, Jr., but later changed his name to Martin. His was a time when coloured people were segregated from the mainstream. So he did his elementary studies in segregated public schools in Georgia; earned the Bachelor of Arts degree in 1948 from Morehouse College, a reputed institution of Atlanta for the coloured people from which his father and grandfather had also graduated. He received Bachelor of Divinity (B.D.) degree in 1951 after putting in three years of theological study at Crozer Theological Seminary in Pennsylvania. At Crozer Theological Seminary, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was elected president of a predominantly white senior class that speaks volumes of his scholarship and popularity among his peers. He received his PhD degree in 1955 from the Boston University, where he was enrolled in graduate studies on a fellowship won at Crozer.




After completing his doctorate, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., became active in the American civil rights movement. Soon he emerged its non-violent spokesperson and popular leader, and led the struggle from front until his assassination in 1968. He is known for his sterling contributions to American civil rights movement. In one of his most famous works – "I Have a Dream" speech delivered in 1963 during his historic march on Washington – he spoke of his dream of a United States that is free from segregation and racism. He played a crucial role in putting an end to racial segregation in the US and securing the rights of the black Americans. It was largely his peaceful struggle that can be credited for the passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Voting Rights Act of 1965. The Civil Rights Act prohibited racial segregation and discrimination in the workplace. The Voting Rights Act granted African Americans right to vote. His vision of equality and civil disobedience was based on the ideals of Christianity and non-violent techniques of Mr. M.K. Gandhi who devised Satyagraha (truth-based method of peaceful resistance) to liberate India from the colonial rule the British. He led 382 days of bus boycott agitation that made the Supreme Court of the United States declare unconstitutional the laws forcing segregation on buses on December 21, 1956. During this more than a yearlong boycott, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., had to face personal abuse, arrests and his home was attacked. In the next eleven-year period of his struggleful life (1957-68), he completely devoted his life for the cause of equality, social justice and empowerment of the marginalised sections of the whole world. He "travelled over six million miles and spoke over twenty-five hundred times, appearing wherever there was injustice, protest, and action; and meanwhile he wrote five books as well as numerous articles" (Nobel Lectures, Peace 1951-1970, Editor Frederick W. Haberman, Elsevier Publishing Company, Amsterdam, 1972). He was the youngest man to be honoured with the Nobel Peace Prize at the age of thirty five.

93rd Birth Anniversary of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was celebrated all over USA on last Monday, January 17, 2022 which was observed as a federal holiday in honor of his life long struggle for equality and social justice.

This was a very prominent and historic day in historical perspective commemorating his pivotal and leading role as a civil rights leader in ending the entrenched segregation of African Americans in USA. As a result of his non-violent but courageous campaign for social equality, the civil rights Act of 1964 and the voting right Act of 1965 were signed into laws by President Lyndon Johnson.

Dr. King was born on January 15, 1929 in a family of Baptists, preachers and pastors. His birth name was Michael King Jr. which was later changed to Martin Luther King Jr. influenced by Martin Luther a protestant Reformation leader in Germany. During his long struggle for equal rights for all Dr. King went to jail 29 times. Dr. King was highly influenced by the power of civil disobedience led by Mahatma Gandhi. In 1959 Dr. King went to India and collected lot of information from the members of Mahatma Gandhi's family which inspired him to motivate millions of people to stand up for action. He admired Mahatma Gandhi by saying that he was a "Guiding Light of Nonviolence".

His eloquent and landmark speech "I HAVE A DREAM" is globally considered as a God-gifted talent which electrified a massive following in his non-violent

approach to send his message across. It brought him in spotlight as a national proponent of organized non-violent resistance. In another famous quote Dr. King observes that –

"Darkness cannot drive out darkness, only Light can do"
Hate cannot drive out hate, only love can do"

There is a lot of similarity and homogeneity in the ideological approaches of Martin Luther King and Dr. B.R. Ambedkar. Both were champions of human rights and social justice.

Both suffered carping humiliations and discriminations in their lives. Discriminations based on caste in India and racial segregation in USA are still posing as hardened crusts of separatism.

The die has been cast. Punjab is fully geared to participate and enjoy the festival of democracy – Punjab Elections, 2022. Election commission has declared the schedule and 'Code of Conduct' in this regard has come into operation, as usual. The filling of nominations by the candidates will start on January 21 till January 28, scrutiny of nomination will be done on January 29 and the nominations may be withdrawn by January 31, voting will be done on February 14 and fate of the contestants sealed in the EVM machines. The counting of votes will be done on March 10 and results declared accordingly. By evening of the same day, it will be known which political outfit would form the next government in Punjab, amidst the Bhangra and Gidha of Democracy.

Elections in a democracy have usually been an interesting and exciting phase. It is more so, it seems, this

AAP, as in 2017 also, was ahead in the 'perception game' but unfortunately, it appears, is going the


one hand and political machinations of political forces at work on the other to keep the weaker sections on the society on the margins. Things are slowly changing for the better due to the constitutional arrangements and relentless struggles of Babasaheb Ambedkar and Manyawar Kanshi Ram among others; like Babu Manguram Mugowalia. The very basis of democratic polity is 'vote' and the dictum of 'one vote one value' enshrined in the constitution, of late, has started to show its efficacy. Since independence in 1947, it took more than 75 years for a dalit, Charanjit Singh Channi, to become the first CM of Punjab in 2021 against all odds. I don't subscribe to the view that somebody did any favour to him and the fact is that it is becoming increasingly clear that dalits are no more interested in keep sitting on the fringes of the system though they are yet to address the

'power belongs to the masses' in a democratic polity. Second, Channi is a suave, educated and cultured son of the soil with an ordinary background

who could succeed in public life and make a definite space and place for himself with sheer grit and hard work. His earthy and easy demeanor to conduct himself as an "Aam Adami" stole the show from the so-called Aam Adami of the AAP, Congress Party's major opponent in the

time. It remained a bilateral matter between the Congress Party and Akali led coalitions from 1966 till 2017. But this time the scenario is different. It is going to be a four or even five cornered contest in most of the 117 constituencies with – 69 seats in Malwa, 23 in Doaba and 25 in Majha regions of Punjab. Dalits have a clout with 34 reserved seats in the total of 117. As of now it appears that there may be a fractured mandate with no party having a clear majority. The next government would be a coalition - Congress + or Akalis + or AAP + or BJP and PLC + with pre or post election alliances. Some of the prominent leaders like; Charanjit Channi and Navjot Singh Sidhu of Congress Party, Sukhbir Singh Badal of Akali Dal, Bhagwant Mann and Harpal Singh Cheema of AAP, Captain Amrinder Singh of PLC, Ashwini Sharma and Manoranjan Kalia of BJP as PLC and BJP combine, are the likely faces as the next CM depending on the magic number of 69-70 +. All the outfits are fully engaged in finalizing their candidates in the run up to January 21, the first day of nominations. Akalis with its ally BSP and AAP have already named most of their nominees. Congress, BJP, PLC and newly formulated farmers party, Samyukt Samaj Morcha is in the process of completing the exercise to enter the Valentine's Day rivalry, the day of voting on February 14.

The diverse issues would be at play – Kisan Andolan and its fallout, sacrilege issues, fallout of Covid pandemic, economy including employment and public services, drugs



same way as in 2017 – alleged marketing of tickets ignoring the genuine claimants and aspirants, remote control and dictation by the Delhi elite, earlier Sanjay Singh and now Raghav Chadha, ignoring the sons of the soil, lack of visible leadership except Arvind Kejriwal, considered to be an outsider and Bhagwant Mann who is struggling still to find its due place and space, in spite of his ability to pull the crowds, in the Punjab's APP hierarchy. Samyukt Kisan Morcha will mostly be a spoiler of the AAP and Congress kitties.

With this background, I come to the subject matter – the title of the blog 'Advantage Channi'. With the growing awakening and increasingly evident empowerment of dalits with overall 33% population is set, ultimately, to determine and shape the political and social landscape of Punjab and rightly so. It seems the situation, of late, has taken full circle. In spite of 33% share in the population, dalits remained on the fringes of corridors of power due to socio-economic factors in the caste ridden society and economic inequalities on

'divisive forces' both inside and otherwise willfully designed and unleashed by the 'Thekedars' of the society with Manuwadi mindsets. Nobody will make anybody the PM or the CM. 


Sacramento County Cannot Afford Another Lockdown

With the rise in COVID cases across the world as a result of the omicron variant, local jurisdictions are struggling with how to properly react. Some areas like Sonoma County have now issued "shelter in place" orders, which means residents can only go to places for essential reasons, such as the grocery store or doctor's office. I strongly believe Sacramento County should not go down this path, and should do everything possible to avoid further shutdowns like the previous failed attempts.

The current rise of COVID is somewhat misleading, as the only thing the media wants to currently report on is the number of COVID cases. And while the omicron variant is extremely contagious, studies have shown that symptoms are less severe than other variants.

The whole reason that the shutdowns happened originally were because deaths were on the rise and hospitals were being overrun, and in Sacramento County neither of these two things are happening. Thankfully, COVID related deaths have remained low, and our hospitals are not in danger of exceeding capacity.

Shutdowns do not come free, and should be avoided due to the devastating impacts they have on society. The Wellbeing Trust, a non profit working to de-stigmatize mental health issues, released a study that found 75,000 deaths during the recent national shutdowns were "deaths of despair" - which includes suicides and overdoses. And in California, nearly one in three restaurants permanently closed as a result of the most recent shutdown.

Nowhere are these negative

shutdown impacts more evident than how they have impacted children. The United Nations Children's Fund released a report that showed the current generation of students will lose \$17 trillion in lifetime earnings as a result of the learning losses suffered during the global shutdowns. The United States Department of Education also released a report that showed the pandemic has negatively affected academic growth, has deepened the impact of disparities in access and opportunity, and heightened the risk of sexual harassment, abuse, and violence.

Politicians, the media, and government agents have stoked fears to the highest level, and we cannot blame the public for being afraid. But we must fight to keep our businesses, communities and schools open - while also needing to recognize the

importance of respectful debate and compassion.

EC Postpones Punjab Assembly Polls, Voting to be Held on Feb 20 Instead of Feb 14

Voting for Punjab's 117 assembly seats will be now held on February 16 instead of February 14 and the counting of votes will take place on March 10.

Chandigarh 17 January: The Election Commission on Monday announced its decision to postpone the Punjab Assembly Election and now voting in the state will be held on February 20 instead of 14 as originally scheduled. The decision was made following a meeting of the EC on Monday morning to discuss the demands of Punjab's political parties and leaders to defer the assembly polls in view of Guru Ravidas Jayanti.

The request for postponement of Punjab Assembly polls was put forth to the poll panel by several parties including Congress, Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and former chief minister Captain Amarinder Singh's party Punjab Lok Congress. The re-



quest was made as many people from the Scheduled Caste community from State are likely to visit Varanasi, in view of Guru Ravidas birth anniversary on February 16, said sources.

Earlier on Saturday, Punjab CM Channi has urged the EC to postpone the February 14 assembly polls by six days in view of Guru Ravidas Jayanti. In a letter to Chief Election Commissioner Sushil Chandra, Channi wrote that it was brought to his notice by some rep-

resentatives of the Scheduled Castes community, which contributes around 32 per cent of the state's population, that the birth anniversary of Guru Ravidas falls on February 16.

On this occasion, a large number of SC devotees (about 20 lakh) from the state are likely to visit Banaras in Uttar Pradesh from February 10 to 16, Channi wrote. In such a situation, many people from this community would not be able to cast their votes for the state assembly, which is otherwise their constitutional right, he stated in the letter written on January 13.

Punjab CM Charanjit Singh Channi's brother denied Congress ticket, to fight as independent candidate

Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi's brother Manohar Singh, who was eyeing the Bassi Pathana seat, was denied a ticket to contest the upcoming elections.

January 16: Punjab Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi's brother Manohar Singh was denied a Congress ticket and will now fight as an independent candidate according to media reports. The Punjab CM's brother, who had taken VRS to fight polls, has now decided to fight as independent candidate. The Congress on Saturday released list of 86 candidates. CM Charanjit Singh Channi will contest from Chamkaur Sahib seat and Navjot Singh Sidhu from Amritsar east seat. Elections in Punjab will take place in a single phase on February 14 and the counting of votes is on March 10.

Key omissions in the first list of candidates for the Punjab assembly election sparked dissidence in the ranks of the Congress party's state

unit. The discontent is particularly palpable in the assembly constituencies of Mansa, Moga, Malout and Bassi Pathana. Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi's brother Manohar Singh was denied a ticket to contest the upcoming elections.

Manohar Singh, who had resigned as senior medical officer from Kharar civil hospital, was eyeing to contest from Bassi Pathana. The Congress is instead fielding sitting legislator Gurpreet Singh GP from the Bassi Pathana assembly seat. A miffed Manohar Singh said he would be fighting the elections as an independent candidate.

In Malout and Moga, the Congress denied tickets to sitting legislator -- Deputy Speaker of Punjab Assembly Ajaib Singh Bhatti and Har-

jot Kamal respectively. Controversial Punjabi singer Sidhu Mussewala, who joined the Congress sometime ago, will contest from Mansa and actor Sonu Sood's sister Malvika Sood from Moga, replacing Harjot Kamal. The latter has since jumped ship to the BJP. Mussewala replaces sitting MLA Nazar Singh Manshahia, who had joined the grand old party after quitting the AAP in 2019.

Rupinder Kaur 'Ruby', who had switched sides from the AAP to Congress, has been fielded by the party from Malout-SC seat. She was elected from Bathinda Rural in the last election on AAP ticket.

The Congress on Saturday released its first list of 86 candidates for the February 14 Assembly elec-



tions in Punjab, fielding Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi from Chamkaur Sahib and PCC chief Navjot Singh Sidhu from Amritsar East. The party is yet to declare its candidate for the Patiala Urban constituency which was represented by former Chief Minister Capt Amarinder Singh. The party will also declare its remaining 31 seats for the 117-member Assembly soon. Punjab Assembly elections are slated in a single phase on February 14 and the results will be out on March 10.

CPI(M) will support Samajwadi Party in UP polls to defeat BJP: Sitaram Yechury

January 17: Ahead of the Uttar Pradesh Assembly election, the Communist Party of India (Marxist) has decided to put its weight behind the Samajwadi Party (SP). Sitaram Yechury is an Indian politician and a leader of the Communist Party of India. He is a member of the Politburo of the Communist Party of India, the largest communist party of India.

CPI(M) chief Sitaram Yechury said that his party will support the Samajwadi Party in order to defeat the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in the state. Pradesh minister Dara Singh Chauhan joined the party on Sunday. This came days after Dara Singh resigned from the ruling BJP. CPI (M) chief Sitaram Yechury said his party will support the Samajwadi Party in the UP Assembly election in order to defeat the ruling BJP.

Communist Party of India (Marxist) general secretary Sitaram

Yechury on Monday said his party will support those outfits that have the ability to defeat the BJP in polls



scheduled for February-March in five states. The goal of the CPI (M) is to keep BJP away from power in Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Goa and Manipur, Yechury, who is on a visit to Bhopal to participate in a state level CPI (M) convention, told reporters. He said his party was also discussing this issue with other Leftist groups as the aim was to stop the

division of anti-BJP votes by forging alliances.

Claiming there was an anti-BJP atmosphere in UP, he said the CPI (M) will talk to the Samajwadi Party (SP), which is the main contender for power there. The BJP has to be defeated politically and kept away from power in order to make a better India, he said. "This (communal polarization by the BJP) has created an atmosphere of hatred and violence, disturbing the social fabric, unity and brotherhood in the country. So, it is necessary to keep them (BJP) away from power by defeating them in elections otherwise the country's constitutional system will not survive," he said.

The condition of the people has deteriorated very quickly under the Narendra Modi government, with unemployment and hunger being widespread, while the country's wealth was being looted through disinvestment, he claimed.
